Principal's Message

Dear San Ramon Valley High School Community,

With spring break behind us, we are ready to face the remainder of the school year. The last nine weeks will go by quickly as there are many activities to keep your son/daughter occupied both academically and

socially. Please continue to dialogue with your student about the upcoming events and continue to check the web site (www.srvhs.net). Here are a few highlights for the month:

Construction

We should be breaking ground on our new restroom facility in the Stadium very soon and hope that it is completed in time for Graduation! This summer solar panels will be installed in our senior parking lot and on some surrounding buildings.

Renaissance Program

Thank you to Janet Willford and the leadership committee for another successful program. We have awarded almost 1100 students for their improvement achievements.

Student Course Selection sign ups

Students should have completed their on-line course registration for next year. If you have questions, please contact the Counseling office.

Senior Ball

The month of April officially ushers in our Senior Ball (which is in May). As we prepare our students for their ball, we continue to emphasize using good judgment, taste, and, above all, safety. Please join with us to let your student know the importance of doing the right thing even when no-one is looking. Our ultimate goal is to provide a safe, respectable event that creates wonderful memories for our students.

The Senior Ball often brings a tremendous amount of pressure for students to consume alcohol. We work very hard to educate our students that alcohol consumption is not acceptable and will not be tolerated. To that end, we will have a breathalyzer on site to use at the Senior Ball if we suspect any student of being under the influence. Our administrators will be highly visible and attentive during this event.

Please help us communicate with your student that drinking and smoking are not allowed during the Senior Ball. We expect the same standards of behavior during the evening as we do during the regular school day. If we do find a student who is under the influence of any alcoholic intoxicant or controlled substance, the parents will be contacted and the student will be released to the parent.

On behalf of the entire administrative team, I would appreciate it if our parents spend some time prior to the event discussing the importance of a safe and sober Senior Ball. I would also suggest that each parent become aware of what is taking place at pre-parties, after parties, as well as what is taking place in the buses and limousines students take to and from their ball.

STAR Testing

Standardized testing is one of many measures of a student's performance. Unlike the periodic classroom assessments that are a direct match to what is taught measuring their performance individually, standardized tests are written to compare students using questions that are below, at, and above a student's grade level. Questions are based on a national sampling of curriculum and the results indicate a student's strengths and needs based on a national norming study. A student's standardized test profile is only one piece of the assessment puzzle reflecting growth and achievement.

As we begin the four (4) days of STAR testing for our 9th, 10th and 11th grade students, it is vital that we understand the importance of testing as well as spending the time in preparation. While we know it is illogical and inappropriate to use test scores to assess the total quality of a school, we also know that we can glean important information about curriculum and instructional programs for our school. Looking at

standardized tests helps educators make decisions about what is taught, when a concept is taught, and to some extent, how well our students are absorbing the material.

I ask that you begin to discuss with your student(s) the importance of taking these types of tests. Take the time to discuss the “whys” of testing and the important information we, as educators, can obtain from the results. Please join with the school to help our students understand what the results can do, also, to give them an understanding of their strengths and weaknesses, as well as what we can learn about our school’s curriculum and instructional programs. A good night’s sleep coupled with a healthy attitude toward the test will help foster a true reflection of what our students know and, in turn, give us an accurate picture of needed improvements.

Senior Cut Day

Traditions are strong at San Ramon Valley High School. They often begin with the best intentions in mind; however, they often include activities that are not in line with our best practices. The tradition of “Senior Cut” day is a strong one not only at SRVHS, but schools across the nation. However, we do not endorse a senior cut day of any kind. To that end, please do not allow your student to cut school for a senior cut day. Students may come home and tell you that their teacher has told them not to come to school. This is **not** true. If this situation does happen in your home, please feel free to call the school and investigate.

We actively discourage the tradition from continuing. Please join us in our efforts. No matter what your student says, we do not endorse any form of a cut day.

Thank you for all you do to make SRVHS the outstanding school community it is.

Legislative Advocacy

SRVHS PTSA Legislative News

On Tuesday, March 29, members of our Legislative committee, comprised of Legislative Representatives from SRV Council of PTAs along with Las Trampas Creek Council (Walnut Creek, Lafayette, Orinda and Moraga) traveled by bus to the Sacramento Convention Center where we participated in our 31st Annual PTA Advocacy Day. We had the opportunity to participate in a question and answer session with a bi-partisan panel of our legislators comprised of Senator Mark DeSaulnier, Assembly Member Joan Buchanan, Assembly Member Susan Bonilla (11th Assembly District) and Senator Bob Huff (29th Senate District). They shared with us their position on the budget and key bills that support education and the well being of children. We brought our key messages to them, speaking up for over 9 million children in California "to invest in education and protect their well-being". We also heard from a "cutting edge" Education Reform panel comprised of Dr. Matt Rosin from EdSource, Rick Miller from Capitol Impact and Merrill Vargo of Pivot Learning Partners. Matt Rosin shared with us results of EdSource's study "Gaining Ground in the Middle Grades", which can be found [by clicking here](#). All three panel members agreed that reform can happen in challenging times but it is a partnership with collaboration between teachers sharing best practices, a supportive and collaborative administration, decisions based on good data and parent involvement. Additionally, this year our school Legislative Representatives reached out to our Sister School Representatives to invite the parent community of our Sister School to join us at Advocacy Day. We were able to start the discussion with many schools that we partner with on legislative advocacy and we are working on how we can involve our Sister Schools in the future. It was another ground breaking year for Advocacy Day!

Juniors: Your final chances to take the SAT Reasoning and Subject tests this academic year is May 7 (Must sign up by April 8), and June 4.

A note about Subject Tests: While SAT Subject Tests will not be required for fall 2012 admission or beyond, some UC campuses and selective private schools recommend that students vying for slots in competitive majors take the tests to demonstrate subject proficiency. In fact, submission of subject test scores may positively add to the review of a student’s application. [Click here](#) to register for the SAT or the SAT Subject Tests. Freshmen, Sophomores, and Juniors:

- Summer school applications are available for all students who need to remediate coursework. (For students needing to repeat a course already taken for which a student received a grade of D or F, or for students behind in graduation credits). Students must apply early as space is expected to be very limited. Placement in the 2011 Summer School Program shall be contingent upon completion and submission of all application materials by May 13, 2011. Priority placement will be based on remediation of F grades and credit deficiency. Students desiring to remediate a D grade will be admitted on a space available basis. Summer school will be held Dougherty Valley

High School, 10550 Albion Road, San Ramon. Session A will meet June 20-July 8. Session B will meet July 11- July 28. Both sessions will meet from 8:00-12:45 p.m. Students interested in remediating courses in summer school should pick up a packet from the counseling office.

The summer school program does NOT offer opportunities for students who want to take a course in order to accelerate their academic program.

Students interested in attending Venture summer school should see their counselor regarding this possible option.
