

FAQ's

- Q. My parents are using the car with the parking pass in it, can I use another car to park in my spot?
- A. Yes, the attendance office sells 1 day temporary permits for \$2.00.
- Q. I drove to school and somebody is parked in my spot, what do I do?
- A. If your carpool partner is in the spot then you must park off campus. However, if an unauthorized vehicle is parked in your spot you may park in a "STAFF" or "VISITOR" spot and proceed to the attendance office. Once there, fill out the alternative parking booklet, retrieve a pass and go to class.
- Q. My carpool partner is always using the spot. We even made arrangements to alternate the usage. What do I do?
- A. You may need to seek a mentor to mediate to details of the arrangements. If the usage between partners becomes a hassle the school may need to get involved and revoke the permits. **No refunds on parking permits will be given.**
- Q. What exactly must be submitted to obtain a parking permit?
- A. In order to obtain a parking space you will need all of the following:
1. Valid license
 2. Valid registration
 3. Valid proof of insurance for the registered vehicle
 4. Check or cash for the amount of \$100.00
- If any of the paperwork isn't submitted together and on time then a permit will not be given.
- Q. My carpool partner will not be here during Wolfpack days. Can I turn in our paperwork with our parents to get the parking passes.
- A. Yes, If all the requirements are fulfilled and payment is given then you may receive your pass, however your partner will need to retrieve their pass A.S.A.P.
- Q. After lunch the front parking lot by the pool is always empty. I have sports after school, can I park there?
- A. NO! Your parking pass is numbered and is to be used for that spot only. If you park anywhere else on campus you are subject to tickets and towing at your expense.
- Q. I received parking tickets last year while parking on campus and I didn't pay them. I tried to register the car this year but couldn't because the DMV put a lien on the registration. Can I still get a parking pass?

- A. NO. You must pay the tickets, applicable fines, and release the lien before you can register the vehicle. Only then can you turn in all of your paperwork to receive a parking pass.
- Q. I am turning 18 in a month and getting my license at the same time. Can my partner and I get a parking pass?
- A. No. All applicants (both parking partners) must currently hold a license.
- Q. I am a junior who would like to carpool with another junior. We are both over the provisional status with the DMV. Can we get a parking pass because we are carpooling?
- A. No. Unfortunately there are only a limited amount of parking spaces. Even if all the seniors carpooled we wouldn't have enough spaces to satisfy the class.
