

Dear Parents of the Class of 2019,

It is with great pleasure that I welcome you to San Ramon Valley High School, the *Home of the Wolves*. On behalf of the entire staff, I would like to invite you and your child to participate in our *Building Bridges* program. This program is designed to make the transition from middle school to high school as successful as possible. The program consists of a series of informational meetings and activities for our incoming 9th graders and their parents. We believe your involvement in this process is critical and ask that you and your child participate fully in all of the steps in the Building Bridges program. These events are listed below.

Date: March 10th and March 11th

Time: 6:30 – 8:15pm (Campus Life and Academic Information) 8:30-9:00pm (Athletics)

Please plan to attend one of these two evenings with your student. The evening is divided into two parts: Students will begin the first half of the evening in the Performing Arts Center (PAC) for Academic Information, while Parents begin in the Commons (Cafeteria) for Campus Life Information. Excerpts of the Performing Arts program will be presented during the short break. Booster group information will also be available during the break. After the break, Parents will then go to the PAC building for the Academic Information, while Students attend the Commons for Campus Life Information. Following these presentations there is an optional athletics presentation for any parents and students that want to participate in sports at SRVHS.

Academic Information - Counselors will discuss course selections for the 2015-2016 school year, graduation requirements, and accelerated course work. You will pick up course sign up information in the PAC Lobby before the meeting. Families are asked to begin discussion at home about next year's schedule before the March 13th on-line registration begins. SRVHS counselors will be visiting Charlotte Wood and Stone Valley middle schools before the 10th and 11th to begin this work with students.

Campus Life Information - This portion of the evening will showcase the wide range of opportunities for students to make connections at San Ramon Valley High School. It will include an overview of student activities such as leadership, clubs, "ins and outs" of high school life, academic organizations, as well as a panel discussion with students.
