#### Surviving the Application Process

 Get organized and work together with your student... but remember that your student needs to do the work (fill out her/his own applications, speak with counselors, etc.).

#### • Put important dates on the calendar:

- Application deadlines
- Financial aid deadlines
- Housing deadlines

 Help your student make a realistic list of possible choices for college.

#### The Right Fit for Your Student

- Be Realistic: What might be a good fit for one student, may not be for another student.
  - What college is best for your student? Is it a liberal arts college or a research university?

 Is it a big school or a small school?
 Remember: It depends on YOUR STUDENT'S personality, ability, and academic interests.

#### Apply Broadly, Choose Wisely

- In addition, you may want to consider the following:
  - Academic Program
  - Quality of Programs. Remember... choose a school that fits your interests.
  - Selectivity
  - Location, Location, Location
  - School Size
  - Living Conditions

- <u>Target</u>
  - A school for which you meet qualifications
  - You are fairly certain that you will be accepted and you are willing to attend if admitted

#### <u>Reach</u>

- A school for which you may be qualified
- You would like to be accepted, and you would love to attend if admitted

### CA Community Colleges

 All students with a high school diploma or a GED, or who are over 18 years old, are eligible

- 112 campuses
- 11 with housing
- Certificates, AA/AS degrees, transfer programs to 4-year universities (transfer after 60 credits as a junior/3<sup>rd</sup> year student)
- Each year, students who transferred from a Community College earn one-third of degrees awarded by UC system

#### CSU Admissions "Rules"

- A-G requirements are a *must*, not a *suggestion must have grade of C or better in all A-G subject requirements* Plan, Plan, Plan
  - Take the SAT's/ACT's critical reading & math highest score. Send scores:
  - College Board SAT 3594 or ACT
  - Apply broadly
- Timing is Everything!
  - Do NOT wait until the November 30<sup>th</sup> deadline to submit your application
- Check individual campus websites for important information and deadlines. Cal Poly early decision October 31<sup>st</sup> must select major at Cal Poly.

### CSU Eligibility Index

- A student meets the scholarship requirement if he or she achieves the GPA of 2.0 (minimum) and test score indicated in the eligibility index.
- You will be required to meet higher admission requirements for impacted campuses and programs.
   Eligibility Index: See handout

#### CSU Eligibility Index

Eligibility does not mean admission – must be competitive
Check specific campuses for impacted majors and programs CSU Entry Level Math (ELM) English Placement Test (EPT)

- Applies to accepted students with intent to register
- Exception through STAR test or SAT score of 550 or better in math and 500 in critical reading
- Math exception may also be achieved in successful completion of senior level math class beyond Algebra 2
- Non-Exempt students will be required to take placement test in Spring on a CSU campus – do by April

Due to CA State budget cuts in education, and an increased number of applications in all college systems (community colleges, CSU, & UC), 14 out of 23 CSU campuses are impacted for the 2010-2011 school year. This means that it will be more competitive to gain entrance into these universities. Apply broadly and to the service area! 20

#### **UC** Admissions Requirements

- A-G requirements are a *must*, not a *suggestion*
- Minimum GPA requirement 3.0
- Plan, Plan, Plan
  - Take the SAT's/ACT's no later than Dec 2010.
  - 2 subject SAT's in different areas. Send scores one campus via collegeboard, ACT - all
  - Apply broadly
- Timing is Everything!
  - Do NOT wait until the November 30<sup>th</sup> deadline to submit your application
- Set aside time to write your Personal Statements

## UC Personal Statement Questions

- Respond to two prompts
- Maximum of 1,000 words total
- May respond to one prompt at greater length, shorter response not less than 250 words

#### **UC** Personal Statement Questions

#### <u>Prompt #1</u> –

Describe the world you come from – for example, your family, community or school – tell us how your world has shaped your dreams and aspirations.

<u>Prompt #2</u> –

Tell us about a personal quality, talent, accomplishment, contribution or experience that is important to you. What about this quality or accomplishment makes you proud and how does it relate to the person you are?

#### UC Eligibility Index

# Eligibility in the Local Context for the UC

- The top four percent of students at each participating California high school are designated UC-eligible. UC has identified ELC students and assigned an ELC number.
- <u>SRVHS ELC students have already been notified</u> and a file has been started by the UC system.
- Students must still complete Subject and Examination Requirements
- ELC information available at <u>www.ucop.edu/sas/elc</u>

## **Application Cycle**

- UC Fall filing period is between November 1 30. May go online Oct 1, but can not submit before Nov 1.
- CSU October 1 November 30
- CSU Cal Poly Early Decision Oct 31 Deadline

**DO NOT WAIT UNTIL NOVEMBER 30** 

#### **TO APPLY**

- Students should keep each campus informed of any changes in information reported on application.
- Check at time of application for housing recommendation
- Students must respond to all inquiries for information from each campus.

#### Application Cycle, cont'd

- Each campus reviews applications in a comprehensive manner.
- Fee UC \$60 each campus, CSU \$55 each campus
- Most admission decisions for freshmen are sent out between March 1 and March 30. CSU may be earlier.
- Many campuses have online access to admissions decisions.
- Students must submit their intent to register (to one campus only) by May 1.
- Request final transcript from Registrar by graduation date.

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#### The ABC's of GPA's

#### • <u>Total Weighted</u>:

Includes grades received for ALL courses reported on the transcript with honors and AP course grades receiving an extra grade point.

#### • <u>Total Unweighted</u>:

Includes grades received for ALL courses reported on the transcript with no extra grade points given for honors or AP courses.

#### • <u>CP Weighted</u>:

Standing for College Prep Weighted' this includes grades received for college prep courses taken in grades 10 through 12 with honors and AP course grades receiving an extra grade point. College prep courses are noted on the transcript with a 'P' in front of the course title.

#### • <u>Cal Grant Unweighted</u>:

This GPA is used by the state of California to determine eligibility for certain loan and grant programs. The GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale so no extra weight is given for honors or AP courses. Only grades received from the sophomore through junior year are used and P.E. courses are not included in the calculation.

#### UC/CSU Grade Point Average

- Calculated beginning in 10th grade in approved courses only (a-g)
  - Additional grade points given for grades of C or better in approved honors, Advanced Placement
- Additional grade points given for UCtransferable college courses
- Repeating classes report all grades for UC system
   Higher repeated "D" or "F" for CSU

- GPA, test scores, extracurricular, essays, recommendations, strength of program, interview
- Obtain application online or request paper from school
- Common application available for many schools
- Check for supplemental application
- Web Site <u>www.commonapp.org</u>
- Check application deadlines and testing requirements
- Early Action/Early Decision

#### Applying to Private Institutions

- Secondary School reports and Letters of Recommendation
- Complete student application packet/parent packet due to your counselor 2 weeks prior to first application
- Provide self-addressed stamped envelope
- Request transcripts from registrar (\$2.00 each) or Docufide \$7.00
- See Private School and Out of State Schools Checklist Sheet
- Send test scores from College Board, ACT
- Provide additional stamped envelope along with mid-year report. Give mid-year report to counselor in Dec.

#### Applying to Private Institutions

Be mindful regarding Thanksgiving and winter break. Counselors and registrar will not be able to process letters of recommendation or transcripts after December 6th, if needed for January 1<sup>st</sup> deadline.

#### Did You Remember to...

- Grades are maintained senior year notify admissions of changes in schedule
- Sign up for your SAT's/ACT's?
  - If applying to UC, sending scores to one campus will send them to all campuses
  - If applying to CSU, use SAT school code <u>3594</u>
- Request that your scores be sent to all colleges to which you're applying? (or *think* you're applying?)
- Make a dedicated (and appropriate!) email account.
- Make sure all online accounts are appropriate?
  - Facebook, Twitter, MySpace, etc.
- Request letters of recommendation in a polite and timely fashion?
- Transcripts: UC/CSU intent to register.
  - Private: \$2.00 each/\$2.00 PDF-Common App.
- *Relax?!?* There's a college out there for everyone!
