Principal's Message

Dear SRVHS Community,

First of all, Happy New Year to everyone! I hope that you have had a restful and relaxing break with family and friends. January has already been a busy month and we're not even through the first week of school.

In the light of last year's tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School, and the recent shooting in Southern California, one of our main concerns at the moment is reviewing our campus safety procedures. Given San Ramon Valley High School's proximity to the trail and the freeway, and the number of entry points on campus, it is a vulnerable campus. It is very difficult to "secure" a school the size of SRVHS, but there are many steps that are being taken to try and ensure that we have better systems and accountability for our students, and our visitors to campus.

The sad part is that you have to plan for the worst while hoping for the best. Statistically, the chance of anything happening is very, very low, but the safety of our students is always going to be the number one priority. As we begin second semester, you will notice changes in the visibility of our campus supervisors, improved signage and every visitor will be required to sign in with Roxann Stone in the Main Office. There will be many other changes being implemented in the classrooms, and with our systems and procedures, which I will keep you informed about as we move forward.

Right now, the biggest challenge for our students is getting ready for finals. There will be "Exam Jam" study sessions offered in the cafeteria on January 16th and 17th for two hours after school. This is to give students an opportunity to work with some of the teachers to review and ask questions about concepts they might not completely grasp. This next week for most classes will be review and preparation for finals and although students will be stressed and focused on learning the material, it's important to remind them that most final exams will not make or break their grade. Over-studying or panicking will not help them to retain material. The more stressed out they are, the harder it will be for them to focus on learning. Please help your students to work smarter, not harder, and encourage them to take some time away from studying if you see them getting overwhelmed.

I would like to thank all of you for your help and support this semester. It's been a challenge just learning how SRVHS functions as a high school, but I love being here and it's a wonderful place to work. It's hard to believe that the end of the semester is almost here, but I am really looking forward to next semester and being able to start tackling some of the big projects that need to be addressed.

All Students:

• The end of the first semester is January 25, 2013. The first day of the second semester is Tuesday, January 29, 2013. Students who plan to make any changes to their spring schedule will need to bring in a parent note, approving the change. Please note that classes are very full and choices are quite limited due to master scheduling constraints. In August students are scheduled for the entire year, so there will not be many changes possible for the spring semester. Please also note that there will be no schedule changes made to accommodate teacher choice.

Seniors:

- If you change your schedule, drop a course, or earn a D or F grade after you have submitted your college applications, you MUST notify the campuses to which you have applied.
- Remember to apply for housing at the colleges you are considering. Space is often limited, so apply early.
- Check with private and/or out of state colleges to see if they require the Profile or other institutional forms in addition to the FAFSA to qualify for financial aid.
- Begin to work on the FAFSA to apply for financial aid at www.fafsa.ed.gov. DO NOT submit prior to January 1, 2013.
