## Principal's Message

Dear SRVHS Community,
Incredibly, it is December already! With just two weeks of the 2012 school year left, the holiday season is in full swing.

## Parent Resources:

Over the last few weeks I have been lucky enough to attend some of the various Parent Education events that were orchestrated by Carol Moore and Carrie Paulus. The Parent Resource Night and the recent Brown Bag lunch with Officer Vincent Richards were thoughtful, relevant and informative. They are in the
process of planning events for the spring semester to try and make sure that we continue to offer opportunities for families.

## Measure D:

Great news for the whole district, especially SRVHS - Measure D officially passed, by just over 1,000 votes. So THANK YOU to everyone who phone banked, hung door hangers, placed lawn signs and voted for it. This summer we will be getting new bleachers (both sides of the field) with a new press box. The other major phase for SRVHS will be a three story building that will consolidate most of the existing wings with the exception of the $D$ building, the admin building and the two newest wings. The planning phase for that will probably begin in the 2013-2014 school year, however, construction won't begin for at least a couple of years following that.

## Common Core:

As we move into the 2013 school year, the focus will increasingly be on the transition from STAR testing to Common Core. Common Core standards are the new standards that are being adapted across most states, nationwide.

The website www.corestandards.org provides an overview of the math and English standards. The website www.smarterbalance.org shows the type of assessments that will be used. As yet, there are many unanswered questions about how this will look once it is fully implemented, but the SRVUSD administration is developing task forces and an over-arching plan that will help all of our schools in the transition. Ultimately, these standards will allow us to focus more effectively on the skills that students need to acquire in order to be successful life-long learners.

## Holidays:

By the time Winter Break begins, our students will have been in school for four months! They've been very busy with academics, athletics, the arts and a variety of other pursuits. Please take some time to enjoy being with your families and friends during the Winter Break. Everyone needs a little time to relax and recharge. I hope that you are able to spend some time with the people you love and celebrate the holiday season as the New Year approaches!

## LEGISLATIVELY SPEAKING...

It's official - Measure D, the district's facilities bond measure, passed with $56.83 \%$ of the vote! Contra Costa County Elections officials completed their count of the 60,000 walk-in absentee and provisional ballots and certified the election on December 3rd. Thanks to the hard work of many dedicated volunteers and the support of voters throughout the district, all SRVUSD students will have access to updated technology infrastructure and will learn in schools that are well-maintained at the same high facility standards.

I would like to take a moment to thank everyone who supported the measure, most particularly the parents and staff members in our San Ramon Valley High School community who volunteered for Measure D phone banking, precinct walking, GOTV door hanger walking, early morning visibility, Election Day poll checking and calling. In particular I would like to thank: Karen Schumann, Kelly Kaplan, Tom Moore, Suzanne Adams, Susan Austin, Susan Lowe, Jacqueline Bennett, Ilona Rodd, Zach Pinkerton and Ruth Steele. And a special thank you to Leadership, for passing out door hangers!

Advocacy efforts to benefit children don't end the day after the election - keep in touch and stay involved in your community. The California State PTA will host a Legislative Advocacy Conference in Sacramento on February 25-26th, 2013. ## SRVHS PRIORITIES COMMITTEE

The SRVHS Priorities Committee is comprised of parents who represent every parent organization on campus, as well as all four classes, and our principal Ruth Steele. Any parent or student with a question, concern or comment regarding our school - school climate, student events, on-going campus initiatives or student concerns, etc. - is encouraged to submit their question/comment to the Priorities board. You may submit feedback in two ways: write your question/comment/concerns in the notebook passed at the PTSA monthly meetings, or you may email SRVHSPrioritiescommittee@gmail.com. Please be aware however, this is not a vehicle to ask questions of your individual student to Ms. Steele. All questions, comments and concerns are submitted to Ms. Steele and answered during the monthly Priorities meeting. The questions with answers are read at the PTSA meeting, shared with the parent organization at their individual meetings and published in the eLINK Newsletter.

Questions, Comments, and Concerns from November, 2012:
Question: There has been an ongoing issue of math and science teachers not returning tests for students to evaluate and practice questions they have missed in order to reinforce the material. Instead many teachers hand tests back in class for students review, then they need to be passed back to the teacher. This year my daughter's math teacher didn't even hand out the test for Chapter 2 to review it until the day after they took Chapter 3 test. How are students supposed to prepare for tests if they have no feedback from past performance?

Along the same vein, is there any progress being made in the Math department regarding greater collaboration from teachers who are teaching the same subject to keep them all using the same tools and staying within a chapter of each other?

Response: We expect students to receive their test responses and be able to review all tests taken before another test is administered. We further expect that students should be able to review test/test corrections so they can learn from their errors. If a parent would like to review the test as well, they are expected to be able to do so.

SRVHS Administration will be reviewing ongoing practices with curriculum leaders (department heads) and discuss with the departments how they can work through this issue.

If your student is faced with needing extra help, here are steps students and their parents should take:

- Encourage your students to use the tools available, including:
o Math lab on Wednesdays and Thursdays after school
o Teacher office hours on Tuesdays after school
o Peer tutoring during lunch
o Meet with the teacher outside of class during their office hours
o Seek assistance through teacher supported websites.
- Have your student email their teacher first, cc their parent:
o Staff should respond within 48 hours
o Parents should follow up with an email if student issue has not been addressed. Be your student's advocate and help them get the help they need.

All these issues are being addressed with the curriculum leaders. Over the course of the next couple of years, Common Core Curriculum will be introduced and Star testing will be phased out. Common Core Curriculum focuses on the process of learning and problem solving rather than just finding the right answer. The shift to a Common Core Curriculum facilitates greater collaboration among teachers, and a focus on quality, not quantity.

Question: Question about smart phones: There is an assumption among teachers that students have smart phones. They are asked to take them out during class and use them in class for study apps. Many students do not have smart phones - and in many cases because their parents do not want them to have them. Students without smart phones feel put on the spot because they do not have a smart phone. What is the school policy regarding this?

Response: We are encouraging teachers to use smart phones as a learning tool and are looking at ways to make it equitable for all students. There are some valuable educational tools available as apps on smart phones and we would like our students to be able to take advantage of the technology they have. Not all students have smart phones, and as a result we are asking students to work collaboratively on the smart phones so they can be shared for the exercise.

Question: 6-8 hours of homework per night is crazy for our kids after being in school all day. We really need to find a better way. Any ideas? It is not making most of our kids better students - just tired.

Response: Many variables impact hours spent on homework, particularly at the high school level.
Homework is intended to deepen the students learning and understanding. It should be meaningful, purposeful and appropriate to the curriculum. The amount of time a student spends on assigned homework depends on many variables including student needs, abilities, processing and learning approaches and classes chosen.

If you or your student believes they have too much homework, encourage them to discuss it with their teacher/teachers. Students need to advocate for themselves so teachers understand the impact the workload has on them. Please encourage your students to speak to their teachers!

Finally, please refer to the district homework policy for more information. This can be found on the district website: www.srvusd.net. Scroll to the district icon to Policies and Procedures. Click on Policy \#6154 Homework.

Question: Is there a lost and found at the school? What about items that are left at a sports practice on the track or in the gym?

Response: Lost and found can be found at the attendance office. The janitorial staff takes any items left on the field or in the gym and brings it to the attendance office.

## Academic Boosters

Please join us at our next meeting on Wednesday, January 9th at 10:30 in the Career Center. We always appreciate parents attending our meetings and giving us input on how we can make an impact on the SRVHS Academic Community.

At our last meeting in November, we had the pleasure of watching presentations from various student groups on campus regarding how their activities enhance the academic environment at San Ramon Valley High School. We are happy to announce that we funded monies to Science Alliance to help defray the cost of their annual Science Fair, which they will be hosting this year; SRSA to help with their cost of having brought Jim Jordan to our school earlier in the year for an anti-bullying assembly; Renaissance Recognition Program; Link Crew through Leadership; and the Speech and Debate team.

As it is the end of the year, I thought it would be a good idea to share with the parent community our financial results from the 2011/2012 school year so you know how your donation to us was spent and to assure you that all monies collected during the year were spent during the same year.

For the $2011 / 2012$ school year, we collect $\$ 347,040.00$ from the following sources:


As you can see, parent donations accounted for $68.51 \%$ of our revenue. So, a big THANK YOU for your continued support of our organization.

We spent $\$ 404,187.00$, which not only was all of our parent donations for the 2011/2012 school year, but a portion of our reserves that we have been carrying on the books for several years and decided to start to expend for the benefit of our students, as follows:


As you can see, the majority of the funds that we raised (65.14\%) went to Class Size Reduction and we were able to fund a large technology need at the school. We will continue to spend $100 \%$ of the money that is raised during the current year so your students will directly benefit from your donation.

## Sophomores and Juniors:

When PSAT results arrive, students please pick up in the Career Center during lunch or after school. When you pick up your results you will be given a handout with details about upcoming times/dates for PSAT Interpretation Workshops. Several sessions will be held for students who have questions regarding interpreting their scores and other general questions. A separate workshop will be provided for parents.

## Juniors and Seniors:

Continue to attend college representative meetings, if you are interested.
Visit colleges in which you are interested during the winter break.

## Seniors:

As stated in the eBulletin, if you need a letter of recommendation you will need to allow your counselor and/or teacher three weeks to complete your letter of recommendation. Remember; there is a two week holiday period during which time no letters are written.

Note: This is the last month to take the SAT 1 or ACT for CSU and UC and the last month to take the SAT Subject Tests for UC.

Check with private and/or out of state schools and colleges to see if they require the Profile or other institutional forms in addition to the FAFSA to qualify for financial aid.

Begin to work on the FAFSA to apply for financial aid at www.fafsa.ed.gov, but DO NOT submit it prior to January 1, 2013.
