## Principal's Message

### Dear SRVHS Community,

Welcome to this edition of eLINK. We are already at the end of the first quarter and racing towards the Thanksgiving Break. This last week included both the College Night and the Ski Swap - two huge events that unfolded smoothly because of the incredible dedication and support of our parent group. I would like to thank everyone who has been involved in volunteering, directing, orchestrating and managing the different events so far this fall. We are truly fortunate at SRVHS to have such commitment from our families.

#### Athletics:

We have a variety of events coming up during weeks leading up to Thanksgiving. The football team won their game against Monte Vista last Friday night to reclaim the trophy that Monte Vista has held for the last three years and begin their NCS series. The women's volleyball team is about to embark on their playoff run, and both of our water polo teams are in their respective semi-final games this Wednesday. It's been an exciting few weeks of sports with a lot more to come. Hopefully we will be able to bring multiple NCS titles to the Home of Champions this fall!

### **Every 15 Minutes:**

Over the last couple of weeks I have been going through all the data collected for the Every 15 minutes survey. The support expressed for the program was overwhelming so we will be moving forward with it this year. Potential dates are still being determined, but will most likely be held in April 2013. Staff, students and parents were all asked about their opinions on both the program and the importance of addressing a variety of issues at SRVHS. In all, there were over 1,000 responses to the survey. At least half of those came from our parents and many shared personal comments that will be extremely useful in figuring out exactly where we need to focus our efforts this year.

#### **Tutoring and Student Support:**

The first quarter ended on October 26th and as expected at any high school, there is a significant number of students struggling in some core areas. Over the last week we have been finalizing our plans to offer multiple levels of tutoring and support for our students. Some are optional for "drop in" support, others are targeted towards students that need consistent help.

- 1. All teachers without an "A" period class are in their classrooms from 2:15-3:00 every Tuesday. Students can drop in for help or schedule make-ups at this time.
- 2. Math lab is now being offered three days a week after school (see website for times and locations)
- 3. Drop in Peer Tutoring is offered in the library during lunch on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- 4. Targeted tutoring/support is being offered on Wednesday and Thursday each week for 9th and 10th grade students struggling in multiple subject areas. Enrollment is limited and participation is required until the end of the semester. This may be extended to support juniors and seniors second semester.

As we move through the year and can identify sustainable funding sources for these programs we will be expanding them to serve more of our students. The goal is to provide both support for motivated students and interventions for those who are struggling. Academic progress is vital for the development of our students' self-esteem and confidence, so any programs we can establish to this end will be a priority.

#### **SRVHS PRIORITIES COMMITTEE**

The SRVHS Priorities Committee is comprised of parents who represent every parent organization on campus, as well as all four classes, and our principal Ruth Steele. Any parent or student with a question, concern or comment regarding our school – school climate, student events, on-going campus initiatives or student concerns, etc. – is encouraged to submit their question/comment to the Priorities board. You may submit feedback in two ways: write your question/comment/concerns in the notebook passed at the PTSA monthly meetings, or you may email <a href="mailto:SRVHSPrioritiescommittee@gmail.com">SRVHSPrioritiescommittee@gmail.com</a>. Please be aware however, this is not a vehicle to ask questions of your individual student to Ms. Steele. All questions, comments and concerns are submitted to Ms. Steele and answered during the monthly Priorities meeting. The questions with answers are read at the PTSA meeting, shared with the parent organization at their individual meetings and published in the eLINK Newsletter.

Questions, Comments, and Concerns from October, 2012:

**Question:** School Loop - It was my understanding that teachers are required to update School Loop at least every 3 weeks. Two of my student's teachers have not used School Loop at all yet this year. If it is not required, what other mechanism are teachers using to communicate grades? And why did I pay a School Loop "Donation" for a tool which isn't being utilized?

**Response:** Teachers are strongly encouraged to use School Loop. A very large majority of our teachers do use School Loop, but they are not required to do so. Teachers are required to post homework in some form - this may be through School Loop, their own website, newsletter or on their white board in the classroom. All voluntary donations for School Loop are appreciated.

**Question:** Senior parking lot needs signs or paint to show exit lanes! People park in the exit lanes especially on weekends and special events. When will this be done?

**Response:** Administration has been made aware of the Senior lot concerns and is reviewing the parking lot signage/painting needs. Upon review, a proposal will be made and a work order submitted to the district. Thank you for bringing it to our attention.

**Question:** Do we have a number of hours homework limit per day? Any guidelines? **Response:** Many variables impact hours spent on homework, particularly at the high school level.

- Homework is intended to deepen the students learning and understanding. It should be meaningful, purposeful and appropriate to the curriculum. The amount of time a student spends on assigned homework depends on many variables including student needs, abilities, processing and learning approaches and classes chosen.
- If you or your student believes they have too much homework, encourage them to discuss it with their teacher(s). Students need to advocate for themselves so teachers understand the impact the workload has on them. Please encourage your students to speak to their teachers!
- Finally, please refer to the district homework policy for more information. This can be found on the district website: <a href="https://www.srvusd.net/district/policies">www.srvusd.net/district/policies</a>. Click on Policy #6154 Homework.

**Question:** Please inform us on the "leaving campus" rule for our current sophomores.

**Response:** Sophomores are not allowed to leave campus at any time during the school day for

dining/recreational/school related reasons. Currently Juniors and Seniors are able to walk off campus during their lunch hour. The district is re-evaluating the open campus policy for upper classmen leaving campus. More information will be available through the course of this year.

**Question:** Who is responsible for athletic decisions at the high schools? I know there's an Athletic Director but since students are involved with participation, do the Principals and School Board ultimately govern what policies are made and enforced? As a public school, I'm concerned about the influence parent volunteers have on coaching and play time. It would be difficult for parents to speak out during their child's sport season when they see unfair practices. Everyone likes to win but we're not teaching our students about good sportsmanship and character if we turn a blind eye to what is perceived as favoritism. Do you know how many parents are currently coaching as volunteers?

**Response:** There are District/School Board policies that govern the hiring of coaches and general code of conduct policies for sports on campus. The Principal ultimately hires coaches with the support of the Athletic Director. There are very specific guidelines on how coaches are hired.

- From season to season the number of parent volunteers will change based on the sport and the needs the coach has to assist him or her.
- The key is communication during the season. If there are parent concerns about coaching or parent volunteers, the school wants and needs to know. You do not need to directly address the issue you may have with a coach or parent volunteer. Please direct the issues to our Athletic Director John Raynor or our Principal Ruth Steele.

**Question:** It seems we are getting more timely and accurate calendar items this year – via email and daily bulletin items. Thank you Ms. Steele!

#### PRIMO'S RUN FOR EDUCATION - Post Race Notes

Thank you SRVHS parents, students and school administration for participating in the 2012 Primo's Run. We had 211 runners from SRVHS, which was 2nd among the number of high school runners and 81 volunteers. Primo's Run achieved its highest participation to date, with approximately 9,000 people participating.

A big thank you to Cheryl Glass and the Jazz Ensemble for once again performing along the 5K course, and a big thank you to Nick Friedler and Leadership Class for having our school Mascot "Wolfie" skate the race! Proceeds from the event will go towards grants from the San Ramon Valley Education Foundation (SRVEF) and are awarded in the Spring.



## **Counseling Corner**

#### Seniors:

College application time is upon us! Application for both the **University of California campuses** and the **California State University campuses** is November 1-30. Do not wait for the Thanksgiving break to apply! For application to UC's, apply through <a href="www.universityofcalifornia.edu/apply">www.universityofcalifornia.edu/apply</a>. For the CSU's, apply at <a href="www.csumentor.edu">www.csumentor.edu</a>.

The last date to take the **SAT Reasoning Test and the SAT Subject Tests** and have them count for the above listed application period is December 1 of the senior year. Be aware, some individual campuses may require earlier testing (for example, Cal Poly San Luis Obispo). If you have still not signed up to take either SAT or the SAT Subject Tests you can still register late until November 16. Register via <a href="https://www.collegeboard.com">www.collegeboard.com</a>. Remember, the UC and many private colleges require SAT or ACT with Writing. For some selective majors, UC and some private colleges may still recommend, but not require SAT Subject Tests. Check with the schools in which you are interested for more information. The CSU requires either SAT or ACT (writing not required).

For students who wish to take the **ACT**, December 8 is the last priority test date. The regular registration deadline is November 2. Late registration runs until November 16. Register at <a href="www.actstudent.org">www.actstudent.org</a>. Again, some schools may require earlier testing.

### **College Application Essay Tips:**

Different schools have different expectations for their essays. The Personal Statement provides an opportunity for UC applicants to share information that supports and augments the review process. It helps admissions readers know and understand the applicant in a more complete way. The UC has two essay questions they simply want answered in a clear, straightforward manner, using no more than a total of 1,000 words. The rule of thumb: Answer the question and tell, more than show. The CSU's have no essay requirement.

Private schools allow for, and may prefer, more creative writing. It helps to know your audience here: What does this school appreciate and look for in applicants? Reed College in Oregon and the University of Chicago look for very bright, intellectual students; an essay reflecting these traits will win points with them. Liberal Arts colleges such as Pitzer, Carlton, and Middlebury may enjoy and reward creative essays. With these schools, "Show, don't tell," applies better.

Students may ask for help with college essays from Counselors, English teachers, and the Career Center. Be sure to allow enough time to make any revisions and still meet deadlines.

#### **Counselor Letter of Recommendation:**

Students who need a counselor letter of recommendation for colleges with an application deadline of January 1, **MUST** submit their letter of recommendation packet to their counselor by **FRIDAY**, **NOVEMBER 30, 2012**.

#### **Financial Aid:**

All students should apply for financial aid, regardless of their family's income or circumstances. Even if some students think their family income is too high to receive financial aid, they may still qualify for grants, work-study, or low-interest loans for students and parents.

The application period for the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will be January 1-March 2. Students should go to the Career Center to get a Cal Grant form, complete it, and then take it to our school registrar, Ms. Murray, by the deadline.
