## Principal's Message

Dear SRVHS Community,
As we head into October there are a dizzying array of events coming up. Between Homecoming week and Red Ribbon Week we have the homecoming rally, parade, game, dance, and then Primo's Run! This is an incredibly busy time of year and our staff, students and parents are doing an amazing job getting ready for all the different events. Janet Willford (our leadership teacher) is an outstanding role model and teacher for our students. She helps to guide their enthusiasm and ideas as they plan events for the student body and staff over the next two weeks. I have been really impressed by the level of spirit and pride in our students and they do an incredible job of representing everything that is great about SRVHS.

Our athletes are also on their way to some outstanding seasons. I have been able to watch some of the girls tennis, water polo and volleyball games and have been really impressed by the talent and sportsmanship of our students. Our football team is also beginning to establish a strong league record after some early season struggles and I am hopeful that this will be another stellar year for our athletic teams.

We are also trying to navigate the transition from the current STAR testing program toward the newly developed Common Core standards during our staff development day on October 5th. These standards have been developed in an attempt to address some of the inadequacies that were presented by the STAR program. They will also create some consistency across each of the different states. STAR requires the acquisition of a wide range of content standards that leave little room for depth and inquiry. In contrast, Common Core focuses more on expanding levels of knowledge and skills based learning. However, the transition from one system to another is never simple and it is unclear how all of the components will fall into place over the next couple of years.

Finally, researcher and author Madeline Levine spoke at SRVHS on Monday night this last week. She is the author of two books "The Price of Privilege" and "Teaching Our Children Well". This was a combined presentation from Rakestraw Books in Danville and EPIC, a resource based support group founded by Robin Kelly. Madeline Levine's presentation focused on the challenges of raising our children in a time where competition, pressure and academic preparation for college are making it difficult for our youth to find any breathing room as they juggle increasingly intense schedules. Her focus on intrinsic vs. extrinsic motivation in students (as also researched by Po Bronson and Ashley Merryman, "The Praise Paradox") provided some interesting advice for everyone present.

## LEGISLATIVELY SPEAKING...

## PTA Supports Measure D

The San Ramon Valley High PTSA has voted to support Measure D, which will upgrade our San Ramon Valley schools so all students have access to safe and quality classrooms that support a 21 st century education. Measure D will be on the November 2012 ballot.

The SRVHS PTSA has voted to support Measure D because it will upgrade our school facilities so that all students will have access to safe and well-maintained classrooms that prepare them for college and $21^{\text {st }}$ century careers. Measure D will upgrade technology infrastructure and renovate aging science labs, classrooms, and school facilities to facilitate teaching and learning of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) curricula, as well as language arts and history. SRVUSD schools rank among the top in the state and the nation by nearly every measure. Consequently, families with school-aged children are moving into our valley, and this has caused our schools' populations to swell throughout the district. Upgrades and new facilities are needed to accommodate this growth and better ensure that students can attend their neighborhood schools.

The funds from Measure D will go directly to our San Ramon Valley Unified schools and are controlled locally. The State cannot touch the money. In addition, an independent citizens' oversight committee will ensure that funds from the measure are spent as promised.

## SRVHS PRIORITIES COMMITTEE

The SRVHS Priorities Committee is comprised of parents who represent every parent organization on campus, as well as all four classes, and our principal Ruth Steele. Any parent or student with a question, concern or comment regarding our school - school climate, student events, on-going campus initiatives or student concerns, etc. - is encouraged to submit their question/comment to the Priorities board. You may submit feedback in two ways: write your question/comment/concerns in the notebook passed at the PTSA monthly meetings, or you may email SRVHSPrioritiescommittee@gmail.com. Please be aware however, this is not a vehicle to ask questions of your individual student to Ms. Steele. All questions, comments and concerns are submitted to Ms. Steele and answered during the monthly Priorities meeting. The questions with answers are read at the PTSA meeting, shared with the parent organization at their individual meetings and published in the eLINK Newsletter.

Questions, Comments, and Concerns from September 13, 2012:
Question: Are block schedules still being considered? Why or why not?
Response: Block schedules are a multi high school issue, and as a result the superintendent evaluates it across the entire district. It is not a site decision. Block schedules may be discussed/considered at a later date, and when that happens high school principals will be involved in discussions.

Question: Can we place an emphasis on kid's carpooling to school? Is there any program in place to emphasize the value of carpooling?
Response: An emphasis on carpooling goes hand in hand with our limited parking on and around campus. We will continue to encourage carpooling. As we revisit the parking permit process, carpooling will be a part of the solution component. The town of Danville supports carpooling through awareness flyers given out at registration.

Question: Why must kids carry Student ID at all times and what are the repercussions if they do not have it with them?
Response: The student ID policy is maintained for both the convenience and safety of our students. Students must present a student ID to attend sports and school events and conduct necessary school business - checking out textbooks, buying dance tickets, etc. Juniors and Seniors must show their student ID's to leave campus for lunch. Having their student ID at all times allow students to participate in all events and activities. From a campus safety standpoint, students are occasionally asked to show ID to ensure they belong on campus and are not a visitor without approval.

Question: The first week of school teachers asked for specific supplies (notebook, book, etc.) but made the requests on different days. Some offered points if items were brought in the next day. So some parents felt they had to go out each evening for the specific requested item. Can this be coordinated next year and all items be requested together the first day of school or on school loop before school begins?
Response: The administration will work with the teachers next year to coordinate a timeline for suggested classroom items.

Question: Will students be allowed to wear appropriate length "track shorts"? Other shorts sold at stores are too short.
Response: Appropriate Track shorts are ok for school. Please refer to the dress code policy for further detail.

Question: Is there a process that interested out of SRVHS boundaries students must follow to gain entrance to SRVHS? How many did SRVHS accept this year and is there a cap?
Response: There is an intradistrict (coming from within our district) transfer policy and an interdistrict (coming from outside the district) transfer policy that all students must follow for consideration for SRVHS placement. 125 students were accepted in the 2012-13 school year from the combined processes. The district will close enrollment to incoming students when the enrollment limits are met. The higher the numbers per class - our Freshman and Sophomore class - the earlier enrollment will close. SRVHS is the home to 2191 students today.

Question: Has there been a drop off area established to replace the Den?
Response: The Den has been turned into an office space for our School Resource Officer. A replacement drop off spot is in process, and will be announced as soon as space has been identified.

Question: Currently our band trailer is being stored in a lot in Martinez, which is extremely inconvenient and expensive. We would like to have storage on campus, preferably in the parking lot near the band room/theater room loading dock. How can we move forward on this issue?
Response: District facilities maintenance staff has indicated there is not space on campus for a storage facility. Ruth will continue to look into it further with the district.

qualify every semester can achieve Level 7 upon graduation. There will be a list of all levels posted in the career center as well as on the school website under the student section and Academic Letter once the qualification period is complete.
